#### Wool Act





in the City of Occess, maketh Oath, That Hest Hearing Miles of the Parish of Wound up, or Buried in any Shirt, Shift, Sheet or Shroud, made or mingled with Flax, Hemp, Silk, Hair, Gold or Silver, or other than what is made of Sheeps Wool only, nor in any Coffin lined or faced with any Cloth, Stuff, or any other thing what sovermade or mingled with Flax, Hemp, Silk, Hair, Gold or Silver, or any other Material, contrary to the late Alt of Parliament for burying in VVoollen, but Sheeps Wool only. Dated the Survey of the Reign of our Sovereign by the Grace of Gud, of Great-Britain, France, and Ireland, King Defender of the Faith, &cc. and in the Tear of our Lord God, 1721
