- The purpose of the presentation is to update the Forum on the services within the Health and Wellbeing hub.
- The project is in it's very last phase of approval which is called Gateway 3.
- On 2nd November 16 members of the project board, including Healthwatch will each have a one-to-one interview with the Gateway review team. This is a ministerial team from the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and is the last step in the business process.
- The purpose is to examine programmes and projects at key decision points in their lifecycle. It
 looks ahead to provide assurance that they can progress successfully to the next stage, improve
 efficiency, gain better value for money from their commercial activities and deliver improved
 success. The Process is best practice in central civil government, the health sector, local
 government and Defence.



- Seven outpatient rooms to be used for BHRUT OP services
- Integrated links include to community services, VCSE, diagnostics and minor ops see above example

Services within SOA-Second Floor

- Renal unit
- New mini integrated hub within the floor offering services to those attending for dialysis
 - Social prescribing
 - Diabetes education
 - Foot checks
- Enhanced education/entertainment/wellbeing offer whilst attached to dialysis



Bookable Spaces-Ground & First Floor

Double Group Room:


• For larger groups such as health visiting, antenatal, balance exercise groups, psychological wellbeing groups, paediatric speech and language therapy groups for both weekday and weekends.

Double meeting room

- For staff teaching, meetings during the week
- For small patient education groups weekends e.g. diabetes training

Three bookable rooms

- 1025: Mental health and wellbeing bias
- E.g. St Francis Hospice/ palliative care teams, psychological therapies, perinatal parent infant MH Service, Age UK
- 1022: Adult bias
- E.g. nutrition and dietetics, cardiac services, respiratory service, diabetes service, physio MSK, social services (joint working), neuro CNS
- 1026: CYP bias
- E.g. Newborn hearing screener, paediatrician, specialist asthma nurse CYP, child and adolescent SLT, specialist diabetes nurse CYP





Bookable Physio Gym-First Floor

Physio Gym will be bookable for:

- Complex multidisciplinary rehabilitation requiring equipment/ space for a larger W/C or more MDT members
- Specialist MDT assessment- such as falls team, heart failure, COPD which involve physical assessment and multiple MDT members



Hub Gardens & Café

- Bookable zone in café for health and wellbeing groups
- Bookable social prescribing booths for interactions in a private but less clinical environment
- Bookable areas within the gardens for health and wellbeing activities
